Dear Secondary School Communities across Canada –

A unique **Community Service/Involvement Opportunity** is currently available to all public, Catholic, and private Grade 9 to 12 students across Canada. This opportunity enables students to complete community service hours to be counted towards graduation while also possibly saving a life. This activity conforms to the guiding principles outlined by Canadian education ministries and can be completed from the safety of home.

[Canadian Blood Services \(CBS\)](#) is a well-established school-community sponsor who has historically involved high school students in various pre-approved activities, such as blood donation. **Due to tremendous need, CBS is offering activities related to joining the Canadian Stem Cell Registry.**

The registry in Canada is predominantly Caucasian (70%). People of different races and backgrounds are greatly needed to diversify the registry. Canadian students have the ability to transform this landscape for future generations.

Thousands of Canadian students have already participated and accumulated hours through this initiative, and hundreds have actually joined the registry. It is our hope that **Students Saving Lives** will become an annual rite of passage for young Canadians who are willing and able to participate.

There are currently 800 Canadians waiting for a match. My daughter, Hillary, is one of them. One of your students may choose to offer the life-saving gift she requires. I am a well-respected member of my Ottawa community with a Mayor's citation, a Director of Education's Commendation Award, and an international following. I am privileged and honoured to have the opportunity to connect student volunteers with a meaningful way to be of service to their community, through this worthy initiative.

Students Saving Lives: Diversifying the National Stem Cell Registry

Did you know that you have the power to be a real living hero?

Canadian Blood Services is looking for young adults ages 17-35 to join the **Canadian Stem Cell Registry**. When you join, you give hope to the 800 people in Canada waiting for their match to survive a life-threatening illness. The registry in Canada is predominantly Caucasian (70%). People of different races and backgrounds are greatly needed to diversify the registry. **Canadian students have the ability to transform this landscape for future generations.**

Please consider the following community service activities to enhance your civil awareness as you prepare for graduation. Complete the suggested activities and record the suggested hours. Parents/guardians may approve participation in coordination with the procedures outlined by school Guidance Departments. Canadian Blood Services is **not** required to confirm participation. Please note that only students age 17 and older may complete Activities 9-10.

- **Activity 10:** After registering, a swab kit will be mailed to your home within 2-3 weeks. Swab the inside of your cheeks and return the envelope via mail. All postage is paid.

Complete one or all of the activities and record the suggested hours on your school's Community Involvement Form. Parents/guardians authorize the completed hours in coordination with the procedures outlined by individual school Guidance Departments. Canadian Blood Services is **not** required to confirm individual student participation, but remains available for contact.

The **Students Saving Lives** activity conforms to the guiding principles outlined in the [Ontario Ministry of Education's PPM 124a](#), and can be completed from the safety of home. Schools may choose to enhance the activities with additional exercises or increase the number of hours.
